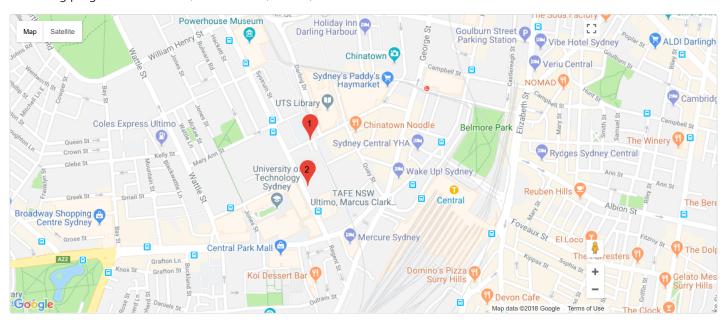
About Women in Data Science (WiDS)
